

Getting Results: Writing Effective Recommendations (4 hours)

Course Overview

Issuing audit reports is a key activity for accountability organizations. However, the real measure of effectiveness is whether the reports identify root causes of deficiencies and whether the audited entities take the recommended actions to address those deficiencies. Too often auditors make recommendations that go unaddressed, or worse, are addressed but the problems continue. When auditors make the right recommendations that can be effectively implemented, they have a better chance of improving government operations through changing behavior, reducing costs, and correcting or preventing problems, including the risk of fraud, waste and abuse. In this course, participants review the GAGAS principles that support the development of effective recommendations as well as practice writing them. Through lecture, class discussion, and small group exercises, this course will enhance a participant's ability to write clearly worded, actionable recommendations that agencies can understand and implement.
