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

APPROVALS OF AGENCY ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES AND STANDARDS, AND SYSTEMS DESIGNS DURING FISCAL YEAR 1970

The Budget and Accounting Procedures Act of 1950 (31 U.S.C. 66) requires the Comptroller General to cooperate with the executive agencies in the development of their accounting systems and to approve such accounting systems when he deems them to be adequate and in conformity with his prescribed principles and standards and related requirements. Approval is given in two stages—the individual agency's own statement of principles and standards and the design of the accounting system itself. The approvals during fiscal year 1970 of agencies' statements of their principles and standards and of accounting systems designs are listed below.
