Subject: Civilian Marksmanship Program: U.S. Army Investigation of Alleged Criminal Activity in Program

In response to your January 28, 1998, request, GAO is reviewing aspects of the Civilian Marksmanship Program. This office reviewed your question concerning the thoroughness of the investigation by the U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command (CID) into allegations of criminal activity within the program. The activity in question-misappropriation of small arms ammunition and rifle scopes by a program official-is alleged to have occurred before the program was converted to a private corporation in October 1996.

The allegations, made to the Army in September 1996, concerned the program official's alleged misappropriation of 12,500 rounds of small arms ammunition (valued at approximately \$1,550); 2,000 bullets (not live ammunition, valued at \$120); and two rifle scopes (valued at \$2,000). The questioned transfers of the materials are alleged to have occurred on specific dates in 1991, 1993, 1994, and 1995. The CID conducted a criminal investigation between November 15, 1996, and February 28, 1997, after the statutory privatization of the program. It reported finding "no evidence of criminal activity."

The Army's investigation into the alleged activity was not as complete as it could have been. We discussed the scope of their work with CID personnel who concurred that the CID could have interviewed additional persons, interviewed others in more detail, and conducted a review or audit of records. However, they told us that because of a number of reasons, they closed their case after they had briefed a prosecutor in the local office of the Army Staff Judge Advocate: the Staff Judge Advocate advised them that no evidence of a crime had been uncovered; the CID had higher priority investigative work, e.g., murders, rapes, and the Aberdeen sexual harassment cases; the dollar amount involved in the questioned transactions was relatively low; and the denials of wrongdoing by those involved in the transactions investigated were plausible.
