

This letter supplements our letter of November 5, 1992 (GAO/GGD-93-6R), which provided numeric data on equal employment opportunity (EEO) discrimination complaints at smaller federal agencies. It corrects and explains further some of the data in the November 5 letter.

We obtained the data on EEO complaint processing from reports agencies annually prepare and submit to the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) and from the EEOC's annual reports on complaint processing. We sent copies of the November 5 letter to the agencies named in it. One of those agencies, the Federal Maritime Commission, subsequently informed us that certain data it had reported to EEOC and included in our letter were incorrect. It also provided us with the correct information. Accordingly, we have revised Enclosure V to the November 5 letter, a copy of which is inclosed.

We also amended a footnote to Enclosure V to give a fuller explanation as to why the numbers in Enclosure V may be larger than the numbers of complaints filed. Enclosure V provides the bases of alleged discrimination for

GAO/GGD-93-6RS, Information on EEO Discrimination Complaints

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The EEOC requires executive branch agencies with 100 or more employees to submit each year information on their equal employment opportunity discrimination complaint processing. Agencies do so using EEOC Form 462 Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Annual Statistical Report of Discrimination Complaints.

complaints filed in fiscal years 1988, 1989, 1990, and 1991. National origin, race, sex, handicap, age, reprisal, and religion are bases for complaints. And complainants can allege one or more as the basis for their complaints. In addition, the same basis may be cited more than once in a complaint. Let me explain.

Complaints involve issues, such as nonreceipt of training or promotions, that complainants want addressed. The form agencies currently use to report complaint data lists 22 categories of issues including "other" and asks agencies to report the basis (race, sex, etc.) for each issue. A complaint may include multiple issues and multiple bases. For example, a female employee may allege that she was denied assignments, training, and promotions because of her race and sex. On the reporting form this one complaint would result in race being marked three times and sex being marked three times. Because the agency-completed forms were the source of Enclosure V, it reflects the counting of bases by issue.

A final point, there is another inconsistency between Enclosure V and Enclosure III to the November 5 letter. Enclosure III lists the number of complaints filed by agency and year. Two agencies reported one complaint in a specific year but did not report the basis of the complaint.²
