To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives

On November 29, 1988, the President submitted to the Congress his second special impoundment message for fiscal year 1989. This message reports four new deferrals and revises the amounts of three deferrals previously reported. We have reviewed these deferrals and found them to be in accordance with the Impoundment Control Act, 2 U.S.C. § 681, as amended.

Enclosure I provides specific information on five of the deferrals, which we believe will be useful to the Congress in its examination of the message. Enclosure II provides a list of the deferrals as reported by the President.

COMMENTS ON THE SECOND SPECIAL MESSAGE

FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE PRESIDENT:

D89-11

International Security Assistance Foreign Military Sales Credit Amount Deferred: \$4,122,750,000 <u>1191082</u>

According to OMB's cumulative report, submitted to the Congress on January 9, 1989, \$300,000,000 of the amount reported in this message as deferred has been released. The amount currently deferred is \$3,822,750,000.

<u>D89-1A</u>

International Security Assistance Economic Support Fund Amount Deferred: \$2,646,760,000 <u>119/01037</u> <u>11X1037</u> <u>118/91037</u>

According to OMB's cumulative report, submitted to the Congress January 9, 1989, \$779,860,000 of the amount reported in this message as deferred has been released. The amount currently deferred in this account is \$1,866,900,000. Total budgetary resources available to the Economic Support Fund are \$3,595,760,000, rather than \$3,637,355,012 as reported in the message. The amount reported in the message is intended to convey the budgetary resources of three separate accounts which constitute the Economic Support That amount, however, includes an estimate of the Fund. amount of budget authority in one of the three accounts expected to be brought forward from fiscal year 1988 when, in fact, there was no carryover, and does not include the budget authority of the other two accounts. To arrive at the actual budgetary resources of \$3,595,760,000 available to the Economic Support Fund, we deducted from the amount reported in the message the estimated carryover which did not materialize, and we added the budget authority available to the two other accounts.

International Security Assistance Military Assistance Program Amount Deferred: \$457,000,000 <u>1191080</u>

According to OMB's cumulative report, submitted to the Congress on January 9, 1989, \$9,000,000 of the amount

reported in this message as deferred has been released. The amount currently deferred is \$448,000,000.

D89-13 International Security Assistance International Military Education and Training Amount Deferred: \$37,400,000 1191081

According to OMB's cumulative report, submitted to the Congress on January 9, 1989, all budget authority in this account reported as deferred has been released.

D89-14 Agency for International Development International Disaster Assistance, Executive Amount Deferred: \$18,125,000 <u>11X1035</u>

According to OMB's cumulative report, submitted to the Congress on January 9, 1989, \$4,796,000 reported as deferred has been released. The amount deferred is thus \$13,329,000, not \$18,125,000 as reported in the message.

The apportionment schedule also indicates that because the actual unobligated balance brought forward on October 1 was greater than previously estimated, total budgetary resources available to the account are \$30,560,575, rather than \$29 million as noted in the message.
