Dear Mrs. Boxer:

In a January 30, 1984, letter, you and eight other Members of Congress expressed interest in determining the cost of the Department of Defense's (DOD) homosexual exclusion policy. As subsequently agreed with your staff, we obtained answers from DOD to 18 specific questions regarding the cost of enlisted personnel recruitment, training, prosecution, and replacement of active service members found to be homosexual and separated from the military. (See encl. I.) Similar data for officers was not derived because such a small number of officers are separated for homosexuality that no real trend could be presented. Some summary officer data has been provided in enclosure II. We did not verify the accuracy or reliability nor analyze the information provided by DOD. Also provided is a copy of the DOD fact sheet that outlines DOD policy and its basis. (See encl. III.)

- --It is DOD policy that active duty men and women found to be homosexual must be separated from the military services. DOD believes that homosexuality is incompatible with military service because the presence of homosexuals in the military environment seriously impairs the accomplishment of the military mission.
- --During the last 10 years (1974-83), an average of 377,482 people were inducted into the military each year, and an average of 393,018 service members were discharged.
- --During the last 10 years, the Department of Defense separated 14,311 members for homosexuality which accounted for less than four-tenths of one percent of the almost four million service members separated. During this period, homosexuality ranked 12th among the 14 discharge categories.

- --During the last 10 years, the average length of service for all persons discharged was 5.6 years (3.9 years if retirement is excluded). The average time in service for individuals separated for homosexuality for the last 10 years was 3 years.
- --The average rank of a service member discharged in the last 10 years was almost the grade of E-4 (about E-3 if retirement is excluded). The average rank of service members discharged for homosexuality during the last 10 years was almost E-3.
- -- The average cost to get a service member to his or her first permanent duty station is currently estimated to be \$12,299.
- --During fiscal year 1983, investigations and prosecutorial activity dealing with homosexuality represented 2.4 percent of the total investigations (1,619 of 67,282) and 0.5 percent of the total cost (\$.373 of \$77.6 million). The average cost of processing a complaint about the homosexuality of a service member, excluding administrative support to the investigative staff, was \$230 during fiscal year 1983.

#### CONGRESSIONAL QUESTIONS PROVIDED BY GAO

- 1. How many people are inducted into the military each year?
  - Accession statistics are provided in Attachment 1
    - -- Non prior service, prior service and total accessions for FY74 through FY83 by Service and by DoD total as well as ten year average by Service.
- 2. What is the cost of inducting a servicemember (i.e., total of advertising, office overhead, salaries of personnel, cost of processing the paperwork, etc.)?
  - The variable cost to the Army to get a soldier to his or her first permanent duty station was estimated to be \$12,299 in the DoD submission of the President's budget for FY84. This included:

- This cost can be used as a raw estimate for all Services and should be used in place of any estimation of data requested for Question 9.b.
- 3. What is the total number of servicemembers discharged in each of the last ten years?
  - The data provided lists fourteen general reasons or categories of separation that have been recognized for many years. The explanation sheet provides the basis for each reason (Attachment 2).
  - The data is arranged by year for each Military Service (Attachment 3).
  - The average years of service (avg. YOS) and average permanent grade (avg. PGD) (see explanation sheet) are provided for each category below the number separated.
- 4. How many persons have been separated from each branch of the Service based on homosexuality during each of the last ten years?
  - The Department of Defense separated 14,661 members for homosexuality during the last ten years which accounted for less than four tenths of one percent of the almost four million servicemembers separated. (Of the 14,661 separations, 350 were during FY7T; however, in order to arrive at statistical ten year averages these individuals are not included in subsequent analysis).
  - The data is provided on line 7 of the report in Attachment 3.
- 5. What are the five leading categories under which servicemembers are discharged?

- The five leading categories for the last ten years are (1) completion of enlistment (ETS); (2) convenience of government (COG); (3) retirement; (4) unsatisfactory performance, and (5) in lieu of courts-martial.

- A spread sheet for all ten years with all categories prioritized is provided in Attachment 4. The basis for this is Attachment 3.
- 6. How many servicemembers have been discharged under each of these five categories during each of the last ten years?
  - The numerical data is provided by Military Service and DoD total in Attachment 3.
  - The numerical data also prioritizes the average years of service (avg. YOS) and average permanent grade (avg. PGD) for each year and discharge category (Attachment 3).
- 7. During the last ten years, what is the average length of service of one who was discharged, in each of the five categories?
  - The average length of service for all discharges in the last ten years is 5.6 years (Attachment 3). The averages for the DoD top five categories are provided below:
    - -- (1) Completion of Enlistment 5.1 years
      - (2) Convenience of Government 4.0 years
    - -- (3) Retirement 20.5 years
    - -- (4) Unsatisfactory Performance 2.4 years
    - -- (5) In Lieu of Court-Martial 3.0 years
  - The average length of service and average permanent grade discharge category code number on the data sheets must be matched to the prioritized discharge category.
- 8. What was the average time served by a person who was separated for homosexuality during each of the last ten years?
  - The average time in service for individuals separated for homosexuality for the last ten years is three years (Attachment 3).
  - This information for each of the ten years is also provided in line 7 of the numerical data (Attachment 3).
- 9. What is the average cost of maintaining a servicemember (i.e., total of costs of training, housing, food, benefits, etc.)? By week, through basic training and by rank.
  - The average cost of maintaining a servicemember through basic training, is \$3,300 for Army members. This amount is included in the costs provided in response to Question 2.

- The average annual costs of maintaining an Army enlisted member is provided in Attachment 5. This can be used with reasonable accuracy to calculate the weekly and by rank costs.

- 10. What was the average cost of discharging a servicemember from the initial investigation through the completion of all paper work?
  - a) How does this figure vary if the discharge is contested and the military provides counsel and a hearing?
  - b) How many cases each year are contested?
  - c) How many cases each year involving homosexuality are contested?
  - d) What psychiatric resources are used in the dismissal process for homosexuality and what is the cost of these services?
  - There is no way to estimate with any reasonable accuracy a total cost of discharging servicemembers.
    - -- The cost of contested discharges therefore cannot be made.
    - -- We do not maintain statistics on the number of involuntary separations that are contested by servicemembers or the number in which servicemembers accept a proposed separation.
    - -- Because psychiatric evaluations are not required in homosexual discharge cases, we have no statistics on the number of such cases in which psychiatric services were used.
- 11. What percent of investigations and prosecutorial activity involves dealing with homosexuality and what is the equivalent cost as a percentage of total cost?

12. Is there any method of measuring the number of discharge proceedings, and the estimated cost of such proceedings, in which homosexuality is a factor but is not explicitly cited as such?

- Because members of the Armed Forces are advised of the reasons for separation under DoD Directive 1332.14, homosexuality will be cited as a factor in cases in which it provides a basis for separating the servicemember.
- 13. What was the average rank of a servicemember who was discharged during each of the last ten years?
  - The average rank of a servicemember discharged in the last ten years is provided in Attachment 3.
  - The average rank for the last ten years has been 3.7 which is between the grades of E-3 and E-4.
    - -- With a high of 3.8 and low of 3.5.
- 14. What was the average rank of a servicemember who was discharged for homosexuality during each of the last ten years?
  - The average rank of servicemembers discharged for homosexuality is provided in line 7 of Attachment 3 by fiscal year.
  - The average for the last ten years is 2.9 or almost E-3.
- 15. What is the average number of complaints received each year regarding another's homosexuality? Who initiates such complaints?
  - The number of complaints of homosexuality that have been investigated for each of the last ten years is provided at Attachment 6. This data is collected by the Military Departments' investigators but does not indicate who initiated the complaints. An individual case file review would be required to make that determination.
- 16. How many investigations are initiated other than as a result of complaints and how are such investigations initiated?
  - The Military Departments cannot determine how many investigations are initiated for reasons other than complaints without an individual case file review.
- 17. What is the average cost of processing a complaint about the homosexuality of a servicemember?
  - Average costs for homosexuality investigations are below the overall averages for all investigations.
  - The estimates below for FY83 do not include administrative support to the investigative staffs.

18. How many investigations of homosexuality, involving how many service people, take place without resulting in discharge proceedings?

- There is no way to provide an estimate to this question.
  Investigations start in one reporting year (ususally calendar year)
  while separations are reported by fiscal year.
- Additionally, not all homosexuality separations involve a reported formal investigations.

### DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE FACT SHEET

#### HOMOSEXUALS IN THE ARMED FORCES

It is Department of Defense policy that homosexuality is incompatible with military service. The presence in the military environment of persons who engage in homosexual conduct or who, by their statements, demonstrate a propensity to engage in homosexual conduct, seriously impairs the accomplishment of the military mission. The presence of such members adversely affects the ability of the Armed Forces to maintain discipline, good order, and morale; to foster mutual trust and confidence among servicemembers; to ensure the integrity of the system of rank and command; to facilitate assignment and worldwide deployment of servicemembers who frequently must live and work under close conditions affording minimal privacy; to recruit and retain members of the Armed Forces; to maintain the public acceptability of military service; and to prevent breaches of security.

January 16, 1981, a change to DoD Directive 1332.14, Administrative Separations," was promulgated to reaffirm the DoD policy on homosexuality and to clarify the procedures to be used in processing homosexual cases. The Directive authorizes separation for a homosexual act (including attempt and solicitation), admission of homosexuality, homosexual marriage. In such cases, separation is mandatory unless the servicemember shows that he or she is not a homosexual and meets the other standards set forth in the Directive. The Directive also affords the right to a board hearing in all homosexual separations. Homosexuals will no longer be processed for separation by reason of unsuitability or misconduct, instead they will be processed under a new provision entitled "Homosexuality." servicemembers may receive an Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) discharge dependent on their overall service record. A Discharge Under Other Than Honorable Conditions may be issued under the following circumstances: the act was committed by use of force, coercion or intimidation; with a person under 16 years of age; with a subordinate in circumstances that violate customary military superior-subordinate relationships; openly in public view; for compensation; aboard a military vessel or aircraft; or in another location subject to military control under aggravating circumstances that have an adverse impact on discipline, good order, or morale comparable to the impact of such activity aboard a vessel or aircraft.
